STEP 2: Register for an Experienced Worker S/NVQ Assessment

<u>Click here</u> to identify the S/NVQ for your occupation.

You DO NOT need to attend college, but you will need to <u>find a provider</u> that can undertake your assessment which can be achieved <u>using various routes including an on site assessment</u>.

Your provider will guide you on anything you need to provide to complete the assessment.

STEP 3: Experienced Worker S/NVQ Assessment

The length of time to completion of the S/NVQ will depend on your experience, the evidence you have to hand, and the type of <u>assessment method</u>, so ensure you register for your assessment as soon as possible.

If your Industry Accreditation card expires before you have completed your S/NVQ you can apply for the temporary Red Experienced Worker Card.



STEP 4: Apply for your CSCS Card

Visit the <u>CSCS website</u> to start your application today.

Online applications are quick, easy, secure and open 24 hours a day all year.

Please note: If you have a card from any of the **CSCS Alliance schemes**, please contact your specific scheme.



STEP 5: Claim a CITB grant

Once you have completed your S/NVQ, your employer (or the contractor you work for if you are self employed) may be able to claim an achievement grant from CITB to help towards the cost.
